2. SHEAC Updates & Next Steps

- Background: SHEAC is a standing committee that advises Board of Trustees; CSC Task Force – works on actions that accrue points in NYS Dept of Environmental Conservation certification program
- 1st Goal: Recruit new SHEAC members
 - Judi Knispel
 - Kirsten (Kiko) Bourne
 - Looking for 2-3 additional members
 - incl. one high school student Mayor and Superintendent thinks it's best to have 2 HS students, a senior and a junior to keep continuity
 - someone interested in trees b/c new tree ordinance requires that
 2 SHEAC members serve on tree commission

- o Want to revise the website, make it more user friendly
- Judi working on FB page

- Anne met one-on-one with Kiko helpful in strategizing
- 3. Sign-on Letter request: Westchester Alliance for Sustainable Solutions

- Letter asks Westchester Board of Supervisors to hire consultant to study how to shut down incinerator and figure out how to dispose of waste
- Inclined to pass letter on to BOT to ask them to sign
- Zoom meeting from WAAS on Wednesday 1/11 at 7:30pm, sign up if interested

4. CSC Updates

- Food scraps Program
 - State grant to promote composting
 - Tabling at community events
 - o 5 residents at Kendal are collecting food scraps, Anne is bringing the scraps to the drop off sites.
 - Maya lives in a Tarrytown apartment, tried composting but it was not really feasible. Wants to know if her apt can have a separate bin apart from trash.
 - O Discussed possibility of more drop-off sites. Maybe shift some from either Beekman or Continental?
 - Anne & Deb were at an event at the senior center, but there was no place to put food scraps inside. Maybe they can put a bin there?
 - We will have data available on a monthly basis but on a delay because
 County calculates weight and sends info to Village
 - Curbside pick up is the ultimate goal (swap out one garbage pick up day for food scrap pick up); also hoping to have our own local compost site
 - Anne had requests from residents at Edge-on-Hudson.
 - Pilot program participation might not reflect how many people are interested - more would do it if it's more accessible
- GHG Inventories Sarah and Char worked on reports, which provide baselines for reducing emissions; will be the jumping off point for the Climate Action Plan. Reports will be on the village website soon. Village issuing RFP to hire consultant to lead CAP process - will lead to more actions that earn CSC points.
- BOT Resolutions: food scrap sites, LED streetlight conversion, heat pumps at new DPW, solar at DPW
- Pending BOT approval: Green Purchasing Policy (office supplies, construction material, etc.) and Energy Benchmarking policy. The state released its own template of a green purchasing policy, will send that to BOT for consideration
- CEC Grants 2 grants, \$5k each. Ideas that have been discussed include:
 - Electric landscaping equipment
 - Mini grants for local businesses sustainable take out containers, induction stoves
 - Electric cargo bike for DPW
 - Open to further discussion
- Fleet Efficiency Policy Judi
 - Phase out/reduce Village vehicles that use fossil fuels
 - At time of vehicle replacement, purchase electric replacements

Gina: Repair Café April 15th at Neighborhood House, co-sponsor with TEAC, we
will distro marketing material. Fixers travel the state to serve at these events,
but we also want to recruit volunteers locally.

5. Organization of SHEAC/CSC

- Develop a calendar of events should build our own calendar of events where
 we want to be represented. Ex: CSC member talking at Kendal, talking at C2
 meeting. Food scraps should be a main focus. There might be unlikely partners –
 Chamber of Commerce representative was interested
 - Should our meetings be on Communitycalendar10591?
- Sub-committees that work between meetings
 - Communications
- Should we work in small groups, or individuals work on different things?
 - o think of areas of focus; communications in itself is a big deal
 - depends on initiative, a policy can be one or two people, but other topics might be broader (complete streets)
- Other initiatives:
 - Complete Streets small group working on 3 intersections, how do we add longer term goals?
 - Tree commission is a real urgency. SHEAC should invite the tree officer to attend a meeting and give a presentation. Gina – put a blurb in the next newsletter. Dan – village did tree inventory a year ago.
 - O Community Garden Diana Loja is going to set one up.
 - Pollinator Gardens SHEAC can help consolidate efforts, there is no one group organizing it. Peabody is doing a vine-cutting in March, would be great to get a wider audience for that through SHEAC.
- Create a chart to show what SHEAC/CSC is working on
- Communications
 - Take photos at events
 - Would love to add videos to website
 - o Bill collecting archives of photos. Will create a shared folder for photos.
 - o Include descriptions of activities on website
 - Send out info through neighborhood associations
 - Kiko updating the website, working with Dan to fix some issues with it. Then link it to FB and instagram accounts.
- 6. Discussed idea of food scrap recycling in the schools Maya
 - Promote the idea, get parents to start doing it
 - Maya is in SPEAR (environmental club)
 - Anne hoping to get info from Superintendent
 - Add compost bins with signs; educate beforehand
 - Suzanna some schools have "Recycling Rangers" program, but need a teacher to lead it

- Maybe a week long pilot program, see if Village would pick up the food scraps;
 weigh how much food scraps there are
- Find students who would want to do a video about it
- Dave perhaps use CEC grant money to pay for pick up for pilot program?
- Discussed plastic recycling in Westchester they are carefully sorted and sold; Ursula Kendal uses private haulers, have been told that only cardboard is sold.
