    - i. Gina will ask TaSH for their standard vendor language.
      - 1. All food will be in one place. Gina is speaking with vendors about not having plastic.
      - 2. Kirsten H-M will lead with Adanhyr and will work with Gina to get idea of number of stations and work out volunteers. Once we have the details, Char will post on Volunteer NY
      - 3. Will ask to have some signage at Rachael's lemonade stand
      - 4. Adanhyr will get 4-5 volunteers from the high school.
  - b. May TaSH monarch education. (5 min)
    - i. Mother's Day market back on the TASH website for May 10th
    - ii. Arlene, Kirsten H-M, Adanhyr & Carol (Adanhyr wants to help plan)
    - iii. Suzanne and Carol will do materials
    - iv. Kirsten needs to reach out to TaSH market manager: Linda Eder, linda@tashfarmersmarket.org
  - c. June 7th Music Festival not volunteering but want to encourage village to do zero waste
    - i. Have conversation with Village to see if they can reduce waste
    - ii. Kirsten H-M, Gina, Char to talk to Anthony to see if can include in food vendor contracts or if village can otherwise exert their power on vendors.
    - iii. We will not staff it per se.
  - d. August TASH tabling opportunity (Kirsten)
    - Possible theme or promoting recycling initiatives such as plastic bags, batteries, etc. "lessor known recycling" items - awareness of local places and refer to page on SSH webpage with QR code
    - ii. Kirsten is considering first or second weekend
      - 1. Rachael, Sarah and Adanhyr could do 8/2 or 8/9

- a. Could Rachael consider what could be a craft or activity with scraps of fabric?
- 2. Kirsten will coordinate. Adenhyr would like to plan it with her.
- e. September or October Eco Fair in September
  - i. Kirsten will volunteer
  - ii. Adenhyr would like to plan it with her.
  - iii. TEAC is considering third or fourth Saturday in September. TBD.
- f. Pumpkin Chunkin November,
  - i. We are not sure if the Village is doing this one... it is not on the printed calendar. If they are we will try to table.
- g. Pumpkin Smash Early December- Carol Peabody
  - i. Definitely table at this one!

- a. Operating budget update (2 min) Char Weigel
  - i. SSH is successfully part of Diana's budget for \$2,000 this year.
  - ii. If you want something laminated or color printed, then give Diana one week notice and she offered to do it for us
- b. Capital budget items (2 min) Susanne Jones water refill stations, bins, and signage
  - i. Budget not finalized but these items are still in
- c. Climate Action Plan update (2 min) Sarah Smiley
  - i. VHB submitted final version. Grant writer has sent to DEC to review and give feedback. Then will present to BOT. BOT need to vote to accept plan (but that is not commitment to do everything in it). Then we can give our priorities to the Village and ask them to adopt a resilience mindset. Maybe we should present to DPW and Parks/Rec staff to let them know about plan.
- d. Devries Park grant statement (2 min) Susanne Jones
  - Village has taken action on this to build new pickleball court.
- e. Food Scrap Study (2 min) Kiko Bourne
  - i. Awaiting news of next meeting timing
- 5. Committee Liaison Updates
  - a. APC Fay Serafica (5 min)
    - Susanne reported that Fay has altered the proposal for their budget.
      Susanne will get updated budget and circulate by email for input.
- 6. SSH Banner (Char)
  - a. The challenge is to have an educational banner that is a call to action rather than just a statement of our existence
    - i. Char mocked one up and will request feedback

### 7. New Business

- a. Nick Kozak created signage in Spanish and English. DPW will make them smaller and wind resistant for other locations.
- b. Salt threatens NY waterway (Kiko)

- NYC reservoirs, esp. Croton, seeing an increase in salination. Drinkability is threatened. Susanne has sent informational material to Matt and will let Kevin know.
- c. PEARL/Billion Oyster Project (Char)
  - i. They have a meeting space at the WI boat club in Tarrytown. Nonprofits may use it as well
  - ii. There will be a trailer used as the lab
  - iii. Meeting happening this week to see if we can bring the Billion Oyster Project to Horan's project in combination with water testing. There is a new reef already committed to in Piermont so that would happen first.
  - iv. HS school students could be involved, they could be in the water doing testing, etc.
- d. Arlene When she converted from gas to electric could not use old heat pumps. Only 2 years old and Arlene is offering free but someone would need to pay to be installed. Please let anyone who might want free heat pumps know. Carol suggested she contact ReStore in Danbury.
- e. Community Food Garden at Barnhardt. New fence coming in that is deer-proof. Matt has marked it off. Not sure if will be up and running for this year but soon. Raised beds. Some will be higher for those who cannot bend over. Fay from APC is getting involved in appearance.
- f. Kiko asked for lawn signs to repurpose for compost giveback day. Kirsten Herries and Dan are good sources.
- g. Gina suggested asking candidates to make paper signs rather than plastic to reduce campaign waste.
